1. (4 points) Suppose that  $M$  is a metric space and  $A$  is a subset of  $M$  with  $A \neq \emptyset, M$ . Let  $D \subset M$ . Show that the following statements are equivalent.
    - (a)  $D$  is open in  $M$ .
    - (b)  $D \cap A$  is open in  $A$  and  $D \setminus A$  is open in  $M \setminus A$ .
  2. (3 points) Suppose that  $M$  is a compact metric space. Then for every infinite subset  $B$  of  $M$  and every  $\epsilon > 0$ , there exist  $x, y \in B$  such that  $d(x, y) < \epsilon$  and  $x \neq y$ .
